All quilts entered may be any size but to qualify for an Ontario Association of Agricultural Societies (OAAS) prize, the quilt must be solely made and quilted by the exhibitor with a minimum perimeter of 324 inches or 823 cm. The size must be printed on the entry tag. These qualifying quilts will go on be judged at the District #8 level in October. Winners from that competition go on to the OAAS Competition in Toronto in February.
